Meeting called to order at 7:06 p.m. by Parish Council President, Russ Whited.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Minutes from the January meeting were reviewed. Deacon Dan commented via email that there was an additional adult study of the Psalms that needed to be added. Paula Jaklitsch made motion to accept the minutes with corrections as written. Jerry Caolie seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.

Minutes from the joint Parish Councils meeting with the Parish Councils and staffs from both ICC and Saint Phillips Benesi were read by PC Secretary, Thomas Arnold. This was the special November meeting with Adorno Fathers Superior, Fr. Raffaele Mandolesi and the Vicar General, Fr. John Paul Gasparini addressing the Councils. Deacon Larry made motion to accept the minutes. Paula Jaklitsch seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.

Russ gave kudos to Donna Kelly for her effort in coordinating the effort for refreshments for the fellowship after the meeting. He also gave kudos to Jennifer and Amy for assisting in the preparations.

Russ introduced past PC President and Helping Hands of Goose Creek representative Gene Alura for a presentation.

Gene explained Helping Hands of GC and the Goose Creek Clergy Association involvement in the formation the Interfaith Disaster Council (IDC). The IDC plan is designed to support local community residents through prayer, manpower and financial support before, during and after natural and man-made disasters. Gene explained that 13 of the 32 local churches are on board to support the plan. 3 of the churches have volunteered to be "Warming Centers" for the IDC. Other organizations involved in the IDC plan are the City of Goose Creek, Berkeley County, State and Federal emergency authorities, the Salvation Army, and the Red Cross.

Gene stated that he will be visiting other ICC organizations to present and explain the IDC plan. There would be a need for people to setup and man disaster centers in the event of a disaster. IDC centers would need emergency supplies such as PROPAK packages, mats, and blankets. Gene led the PC discussion on the question "Would ICC be willing to support supplies to warming centers established by the IDC?"
