OLD BUSINESS:

Christy presented the report on the Columbarium.

The Columbarium Committee hopes to have the pricing set by December, 2016. The same company that built the Columbarium at Mepkin Abby is building the Columbarium at ICC. After pricing, spots in the Columbarium would be available for purchase. The middle spots (at eye level) would be most expensive. Financing would be available with a payment plan. There will be a parish meeting in May for an information presentation on the Columbarium.

Father Jason mentioned the spiritual benefits for the Columbarium. Once a month, a Mass would be offered for all those in the Columbarium.

Christy stated that there would be room for expansion as the spaces filled up in the Columbarium. Amy mentioned that the Stations of the Cross might be needed to be relocated closer to the sidewalk (to meet the requirements of the Columbarium).

Russ mentioned that there are different sizes of urns. Bigger slots would be needed in the Columbarium. This and the pricing is all to be determined after the architect provides the pricing for the Columbarium.

Other discussion points on the Columbarium included:

- No animals would be in the Columbarium.
- Columbarium would be for members of the Catholic faith.

Russ ended the discussion by giving special Kudos to Christy Warren and Jerry Arter for their initiative and involvement in the planning for the Columbarium.

Amy provided the report on the upcoming PC election of new members.

NEW BUSINESS: No report.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Russ invited Deacon Larry and Father Gerry for comments or reports. Both had no comments.

Father Jason reported on the following:

Holy Week went well. Father Jason was especially please with Holy Friday musical presentation by the youth. Even though rehearsals were sometimes very trying, the youth exceeded Father Jason's expectations.

The request for a new organ has been approved by the diocese. The parish finance committee still has to meet to discuss the best way to come up with the funds needed. It would be beneficial to have the organ by next October because of the special event that is scheduled for that month. A loan from the diocese might be the most expedient way in the short term for the organ purchase.

Mary and Mylene are chairing a committee for fund raising.

The estimated cost of the organ is \$162,000. The choir area will need alternations for the installation of the new organ. The estimated repair costs for rerouting electrical wiring and structural alternations are between \$10,000 and \$20,000.

A Eucharistic Congress will be held at ICC on October 7, 8, and 9. The mission is for teaching the church about the Eucharist. Activities during the weekend will include a procession of the Eucharist (possibly on Saint James Avenue), four special speakers on the Eucharist, and a Sunday teen youth rally involving the CCD and YMP programs. This would be a free mission for the parish. Refreshments and free food would be provided during the mission. Registration would be required with ID tags. Attendance would be limited to 800 participants. Headsets would be provided for Spanish translations.

Father Jason was asked about World Youth Day (WYD). Everything for WYD is ready and paid for. Amy stated that there will be two more fund raisers to help teens with spending money and to buy souvenirs to give out as gifts to attendees from other countries. The youth are also preparing hundreds of rosaries to be given out also.

Father Jason closed the meeting with prayer.

Meeting adjourned at 8:17 p.m.
